








The site is located on the lands of many indigenous clans including the Gadi & Bidji peoples.


### **Project Considerations**



Sporting amenities building to suit Cricket / Rugby League / Rugby Union and Football (Soccer) requirements



Siting of the new building in relations to eixsting playground, sportsfield, outdoor gym and adjacent dwellings.



Environmentally sustainable design. Materials suitable to the environment and public usage



Reduce impact on neighbouring low-rise residential setting, inlcluding views into the site.



Manage impacts of flooding



Traffic, parking and site access, along with servicing the building for deliveries and waste management



Provision of temporary facilities to allow sport clubs and public to use the park during construction



Minimise building footprint and impact on services.



Pedestrian movements in and around the building (including accessibility)



CPTED considerations and safety of users including security lighting






















































































































































































# Material Approach

#### Cultural duality of peace and competitive gatherings

The heavy building zones should reflect the combative knowledges of red ochre and the central gathering place should reflect a lighter character for healing and resolution.




White Ocre representing peace/ reconciliation/ healing



Red Ochre representing sports/ competition

#### **Equitone Fibre Cememt**

- Red ochre representation of competition.
- Brown ochre behind bowler to provide contrast with red ball.
- Panel to external walls to be perforated for acoustic reverberation, with bulk insulation within wall.
- Hardwearing material, not easily damaged/ marked.



#### **Glulam Timber Structure**

- Low carbon, natural material connecting to parkland setting.
- Australian made.
- Raked profile to achieve efficiencies



#### **Perforated Soffit**

- Timber plywood finish to ceilings.
- Perforated for acoustic reverberation.


#### Drawing in the colours and textures of Country

The heaviness of the building at the lower portion of the cricket hall contrasted to the upper polycarb portion can be designed to reflect cultural fire, with the heavy base reflecting the charcoal and ash and the lighter upper portion reflects the smoke




Training Facility - South Elevation.

**Metal Roofing** colorbond or zincalume finish.






#### *Materiality + Peace*

#### Drawing in the colours and textures of Country

Draw in the banksia and use colours to visually signify the community places within the pavilion to represent the opening of banksia pods with a heavier and darker 'outside'.





- FC soffit, fascia painted, cost effective.
- **Equitone FC panel** durability, warmth & tactility
- Concrete pathway/ seating with oyster shell additive.
- Hardwood timber to batten gates
- Blockwork external walls
- Metal Roofing zinzalume, corrugated roofing.










- Perforate timber lining acoustics, warmth relating to inside of banksia pod
- **Timber lining** acoustics, warmth relating to inside of banksia pod
- Concrete Floor with exposed aggregate
- Fibre Cement Panel colour through relating to brown ochre, low maintenance.












- Fibre Cement Panel colour through, low maintenance
- Hardwood Timber Bench durability, warmth & tactility
- Terrazzo Cubicle Partition durability, colour.
- Concrete Floor with exposed aggregate
- **Blockwork** durable, robust, economical
- Cubicle doors/rainhood relating to red ochre/ gymea lilly.





#### Drawing in the colours and textures of Country

Using pops of red colours on the roof pop outs can reflect the gymea lilies and draw in the e/w Songline.












**Eucalpytus Botryoides Canopy**

Creating larger places to gather in this central space supports the healing stories after conflict and can be strengthened by their connection to the eucalyptus trees.







#### Drawing on local art styles


Patterning on the long walls should reflect local art and/or making styles.












Artistic impression of artwork applied to the east facade of the training facility building.





Example of patterning engraved into FC panel












